## MEXICAN CHRISTIAN MISSION February 2014

"Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Therefore beseech the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into His harvest. (Matthew 9:37-38)"

(Matthew 9:11-12)

In these verses the Lord is saying that many people are in the world waiting to be ministered to and blessed. We at the Mexican Christian Mission (MCM) are taking this to heart in a variety of ways. As you may recall in January we celebrated the first of a series of training conferences to equip pastors and leaders to minister in areas that are very challenging. We dealt with the topic of homosexuality, something that has been largely ignored by the vast majority of churches in Mexico. We are preparing to celebrate our second training conference on Saturday March 15 dealing with the topic of false teachers and prophets. Many people both in the US and in Mexico have been deceived by these wolves in sheep's clothing". Our goal is to help the pastors and leaders identify is a person's teaching is of the Lord or not.

This spring we are working in a major conference dealing with pornography. The planning is just starting and the Lord has already blessed us with several ministry leaders from the Rock Church in San Diego who are well versed in this topic. It is a very serious problem affecting numerous men including some church leaders. More to come in next months newsletter. The other aspect of sending out laborers is to help those in need. We see that wherever Christ went he was healing the



sick and in two cases provided food for thousands of people. There are so many people in Mexico suffering extreme hardships with little to no government programs, unlike in the US, where they can obtain relief. Earlier this month we helped Mayra Beltran (pictured left). She is the mother of a two girls: Brianna age 6 and Michelle age 5 and boy, Fernand age 2. Their father died in January due to a botched operation in a hospital in Tijuana in January. They had struggled financially before but now their situation became much more serious. MCM responded by delivering a very large food run for them. They were so excited! In January MCM helped the family of Luciano and Ana Crisostomo

with both a food run and ingredients to make and sell donuts. It

appears Ana has perfected the recipe after several attempts and they are starting to sell. Her husband Luciano had his lower left leg amputated due to bone cancer. He continues to pastor a small but growing church in West Tijuana. MCM had

the blessing of preaching there Sunday February 16 on the topic of Envy and Gossip.

A few weeks ago MCM was able to help the very poor family of Pastor Jose Camarena (pictured right) from Matatan, Sinaloa. He started the first Christian church in this town of about 1,000 just over a year ago. Thanks to your donations we were able to make a contribution to help him and his family. The tithes are still very little but things are slowly improving. The donation will help sustain this family as the tithes slowly become adequate. The people are responding, especially their ministry to young children. The kids love coming to the tiny church and fill it up every week!
